This special event will feature a screening of the <u>Decade Documentary</u>, highlighting the progress and advocacy for authentic representation of individuals with Down syndrome in the media over the past ten years. A panel of WWDSS families along with photographer, Hilary Gauld, and the filmmakers, Digital Sabbath will share their insights, and keynote speaker <u>Adelle Purdham</u> will inspire attendees.

Guelph Public Library – Storytime & Community Connections – Friday, March 21 (10 AM - 12 PM) The Main Library will host a WDSD Community Connections event, including a special storytime surprise in the children's area.
